DECORATIVE HORSESHOES

The horseshoe is one of the most well-known symbols of the horse. Now, you can reuse your old ones to create beautiful decorations for your room

You will need:

-Old, rusty horseshoes (ask your riding school if you don't have your own pony)

--Various pointed-ended objects

- -Wire brush
- -Wire brush drill attachments
- -Sandpaper

-Drill

- -Old cloth
- -Hose, or just water in a bucket
- -(Spray) paint



- 1. Wash your horseshoe as best as you can. Get all the mud and grime out of all the crevices using your various pointed-ended objects.
- 2. Start scrubbing your horseshoe with your wire brush and sandpaper. This may be hard work, but you will soon see some results.
- 3. Scrub your horseshoe until you start seeing some silver underneath. The horseshoes I used had been sitting in a shed for a long time, so they had a thick layer of rust
- 4. Attach the wire brush drill bits to your drill and try scrubbing with it.
- 5. Wash your horseshoe in water every few minutes to remove surface rust.
- 6. Keep scrubbing and washing until you reach the desired amount of silver. You could leave your slightly rusty to create a rustic effect, scrub it clean and silver again, or move on to the next step to colour it
- 7. Paint your horseshoe. I decided to spray paint mine gold. My friend painted hers black and decorated it with flowers before giving it to me as a birthday present. These shoes make great gifts!
- 8. Mount your horseshoe up on a bookcase, shelf or even on your wall and enjoy, or gift to a friend.
